It will be a party for a friend.



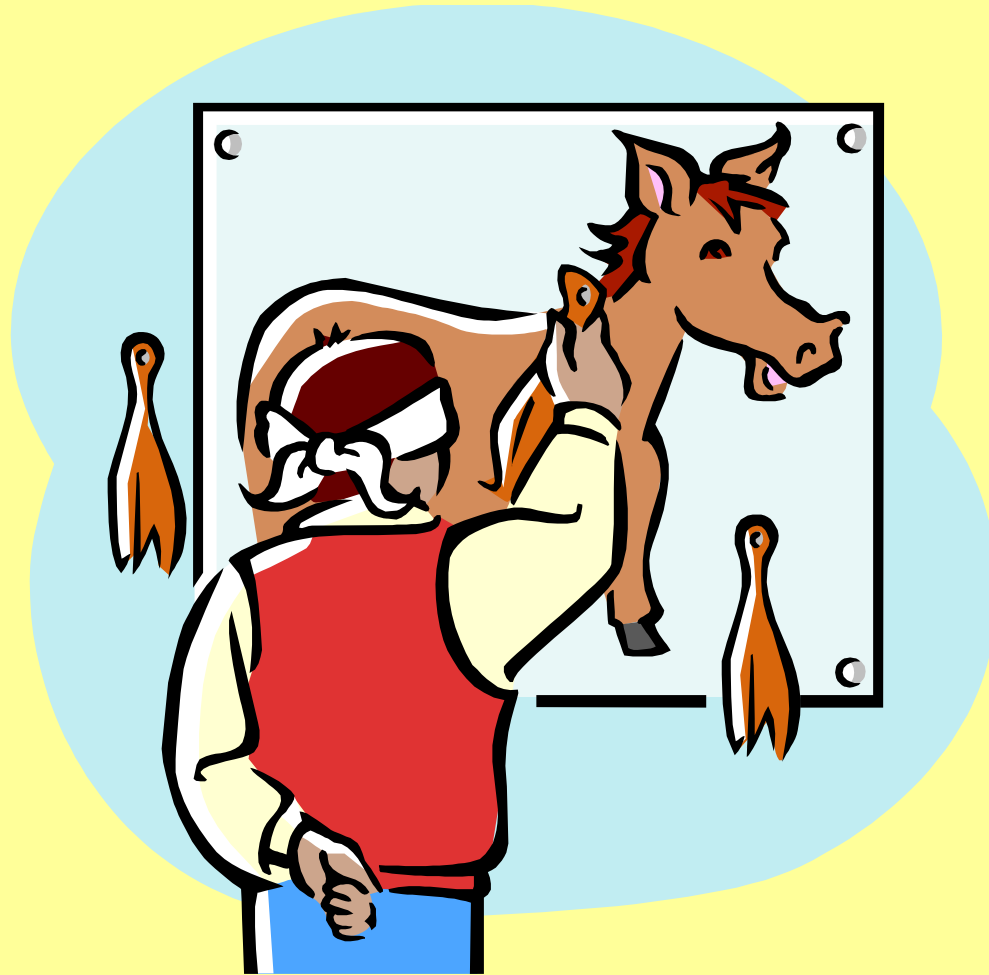
At the party, there are lots of things we might do.
