Project/Intervention	How we did
Supporting a smooth Transition from home to school Issues and Challenges Some of the children have not attended a nursery before and parents were anxious. 43% - 11chn Desired Outcomes That all children and parents feel confident and safe to attend nursery and to try things for them themselves. What we did Home visit form- How parents feel about children starting school, create a scale of 1-5 questions, anxiety, Re ask scale level at parent meeting. *children to take photos of week at school, having ownership of what they want to share, use pictures, work, observations * staff to create an all about me display	 At beginning of project, 80% of parents were anxious about their children starting nursery. We reviewed this and asked them the same question at the end of the first term; now 100% are happy and feel confident that their children are safe and well cared for. We purchased 2 cameras for the children to use. They took photos of their time in nursery which we created small books from for them to share at home with parents. The children found pushing the buttons on the camera challenging but all had a positive mind set and gave it a try. This is due to touch screen phones and the ease of them. We worked with the children on creating a display all about themselves and all of the positive things that they could do. From this we looked at things that they wanted to learn to do and how they could achieve this by giving things a go.
