## **Parking on Islip Street**

We are really proud that the majority of our children come to school on foot, by bike or on public transport. If you do have to drive, make sure you always park/wait legally. In particular, never double park, stop on single yellow lines or zigzags, or block dropped kerbs. Doing this makes it much more difficult and dangerous for others to cross the road, and is a particular risk for chil dren old enough to walk to school alone. Please help us keep the whole school community safe.

#### Oasis Refurbishment

The work on the pond area is almost complete. The area was very overgrown and was not accessible for all children (especially those who use a wheelchair). The new ramp, decking and fencing allows children to access the area during the whole of play and lunchtimes. Liz is now working hard, with children, to plant the area so that it will be bee and bird friendly by next summer! Network Rail used our school last Christmas during track replacement works and they made a healthy donation to school funds which has funded most of the work!

Meanwhile, back at school, we've had fun doing cave paintings with charcoal, chalk and fake blood. In English we've used some brand new golden and silver pens to write our very own 'found' Happy Endings and in maths we've been investigating which practical resources are most helpful and which mental strategies are most useful for addition and subtraction.

# **Beech Class**

Beech Class enjoyed putting together their assembly called 'Herstory'. It was all about women who have challenged stereotypes. They are now studying the book 'the Devil and his Boy' - writing powerful character descriptions and planning dialogue. In Maths, Y6 are recapping over multiples and factors and going back over addition/subtraction strategies!





