



Oi Frog! It's time to Rhyme!



























You could have a go at making your own Oi Frog! Or you could draw/ make any of your favourite animals from the stories!

- Green Card
- Red Card
- Paper Plate (or cereal box cut into a circle)
- Green Paint (or felt tip or paper)
- Googly Eyes
- Water Balloons (green) regular balloons will work or milk tops!
- 1. Fold the Paper Plate in half and paint it green.
- 2. Blow up the water balloons a small way (this is easier with water balloons than regular balloons because they're smaller) and stick a googly eye on each.
- Put a small slit in the top of your paper plate and insert the balloon eyes into the slits so they pop out! Or stick on eyes made from cereal boxes or milk tops.
- 4. Draw legs on the green card, tape them to the back of your paper plate.

Snack Shop / Café



A great way to keep busy at home and get lots of talk, Maths, Literacy, Social and Emotional Development is through roleplay. And most importantly it's really fun! A great easy one to do at home is to set up a simple snack shop or café. We do this a lot in nursery so it means that the children have to count out money to buy their piece of fruit. They enjoy selling it, checking that they have been given the right amount of money!

Children also love making roleplay areas and have great ideas! Here's a few activities you could do at home to create your snack shop/ café:

- Make Open/ Closed signs
- Make a snack menu
- Make money or a till (or just plates work well)
- Cook / make healthy snacks such as chopping up fruit for fruit salad.
