Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope this finds you well. I wanted to share with you some information from the prime minister's broadcast last night. I know there is much talk of schools reopening but this is the current position.

The prime minister has said that primary schools in England **may** reopen for pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 from 1 June, but only if the government thinks it's safe to do so. The prime minister is expected to set out more details on these plans, which are conditional on a reduction in the transmission of the virus, in an address to parliament today, 11th May.

In the meantime, schools in England remain closed for most pupils, but where possible we're staying open to look after the children of critical workers and vulnerable children.

The SLT and I have been discussing this news this morning and I will be taking advice from Camden and the London Diocesan Board before we decide to reopen. Governors will also be involved in the discussions.

When the decision is made to reopen, it will be with our children's health and wellbeing in mind. Obviously we must also consider the health of staff, parents and carers as well.

In the meantime, we are making all necessary plans in the hope that we can reopen as soon as it is safe to do so.
