Dear Parents and Carers,

Autumn Term 2020

As you may have seen in my last newsletter or in the news, we are expecting to be open for all children in September. Our first day for children is <u>Wednesday 2nd September</u>. Your children will be in a class Bubble of thirty and each class will not mix with other groups across the school. This means that you can expect your child/ren to attend school full time (a relief for you and frankly, for us as well!).

Children will eat their lunch in their classrooms and Caterlink will provide a packed lunch menu instead of their normal hot meals offer. Children can, of course, bring in a packed lunch from home.

Although we can't have parents routinely on the school site, we are planning to welcome you to a "meet the new teacher" session, in the school hall. Seating will be arranged according to the social distancing guidelines. I feel it is very important for you to meet your child/ren's new teachers face-to-face. The meetings will take place on:

The Summer Reading Challenge is run each year and is normally based in Kentish Town library. This 💮 year I would strongly recommend to all parents and carers that you encourage your child/ren to 💮 log in, register and read as many books as possible this summer. On the website there are book 💮 recommendations, games, rewards and much more. If you are concerned about your child getting 🔅 ready for school in September then encourage them to read, read and read some more. Joining in 💮 with the challenge is more important than ever this year and better for your child than any other catch up initiative at this stage. Little and often is best, unless your child really gets lost in books (in which case just let them!). You can read to them, with them or just enjoy them reading to themselves.
