Daily Supported Reading



We have also been getting deeper into our clothes topic and learning about how different fabrics are made. We practiced weaving on little looms in the classroom to make our own

decorative fabric using ribbons! We've been very glad to be back in school and playing and learning again!



Sycamore Class

This week, Sycamore Class have been finding out lots about the brave hero, Beowulf. We have learnt about and acted out the tale of Beowulf sailing over the sea to save the day, fighting off the evil monster, Grendel. Sycamore Class have written letters to ask for help in fighting the monster, and have written entertaining stories to describe, in gruesome detail, the battle between Beowulf and the beast.



Cedar Class

Cedar Class have been really busy learning about eagles, reading Fly Eagle Fly, writing poems about these birds of prey describing their flight and how they hunt.

We've drawn eagle pictures using pastels, paying attention to how to draw the feathers.
