Staffing Update

I hope you will join us all in welcoming our new Assistant Headteacher — Ryan Kirkpatrick. Ryan will be teaching in Sycamore class this year and leading maths in our school. Ryan will be on the gate outside Cedar class on Friday mornings.

Flora Grant requested a sabbatical late in the summer term for personal reasons. Governors granted this request and so Flora will return to school after February half term. In the meantime, Zoe Kelly will teach Cedar class every Friday. Zoe has covered in our school before and we are delighted that she can help us each week until Flora returns in February.

Building Work

During the summer, building work has been taking place to create:

2 x new teaching spaces for children with special needs;

a new entrance and corridor at the side of our nursery;

a refurbished corridor outside Oak and Acorns classes.

During half term in October, The Woodlands, (Miriam and Marcia's room) will become our new Breakfast and After School Club Room. In the meantime, clubs will be based in the main school hall for half a term.

Playground Upgrade

The playground outside Willow and Ash classes (we call this The Safari Playground), will receive a major overhaul from Monday 11th September. The covered area will be accessible to parents and children but the main part of the playground will be out of use while the work is in progress. This project will give our children a really improved play space with a new climbing structure, a new play grass surface and a new shed for storage.

There will also be some repairs to the main playground during this time.

Sarah Hoyle from Kentish Town Community Centre has successfully bid for a National Lottery grant which will enable us to offer a free breakfast to all children and adults on Wednesday and Friday mornings from 8:15am.
