
## And finally...

## MyMaths

MyMaths is an online maths teaching and learning platform for children in Years 1-6 which has several benefits and matches the maths National Curriculum objectives. The benefits for our children at this time are:

- children can work independently on a tablet or computer,
- teachers can set differentiated tasks and feedback regularly,
- there is direct teaching in the form of simple step-by-step lessons with models and visuals and the children can practice the tasks several times if they are not confident with a concept.

The platform is really simple for children to navigate and also includes lots of fun maths games which can be used as warm up activities to practice mental skills.
