Relaxing of Restrictions

As you will be aware, the Coronavirus restrictions remain in place until at least 19th July. Sadly, this means that a Summer Fair "in person" will not be possible. I have suggested to The Friends of Kentish Town CE that we plan for a fair in September, when the weather will still be warm and hopefully the final restrictions will have been lifted. Positive cases in Camden are rising and you can really help us by regularly testing using a LFD testing kit. My staff do this twice a week and this means that positive cases are picked up and kept out of school. Please also book your vaccination if you are eligible and have not yet done so. Sports Day

On Monday 21st June, Cedar, Sycamore, Chestnut and Beech classes will be taking part in Sports Day at the running Track at Parliament Hill. Parents and carers can join us at the heath but <u>you are not allowed inside the running track</u>. Please maintain social distancing outside the track, you can watch from the outside of the perimeter fence behind the running track if you wish. Your child/ren will need:

- Suitable trainers and PE kit for running and jumping
- A sun hat, water and sunscreen
- A packed lunch—they will need to carry this

The activities will begin at approximately 9.45am and the children will have a packed lunch inside the running track after their races. We will then return to school for the remainder of the day. Pick up will be at the normal times from school.

The new owners of the Mansfield Bowls Club (Croftdown Road, NW5), Harrison Varma, are seeking to ignore the 2017 planning permission and are proposing to build on land designated as local green space (Camden policy IDS S12). This would end 102 years of club tennis on the site.

Harrison Varma are consulting with local residents about their redevelopment plans. We were shocked to see extremely limited provision for tennis, with only one court and no clubhouse.

There is a great unfulfilled demand for tennis. The Parliament Hill courts are generally fully booked and other NW tennis clubs are out of reach both in distance and price to many residents. Nationally there has been a <u>372% increase in tennis participation</u> between May 2019-July 2020 (LTA survey) and before Harrison Varma made the existing courts unavailable, they were highly utilised by all ages. Kenlyn Tennis Club will continue to provide a community-based, grassroots club accessible to all.

Meaningful tennis provision would be at least three all-weather clay courts and a new clubhouse in the redevelopment, <u>as required by the</u> <u>previous planning permission granted by Camden.</u> This would benefit local Schools and Highgate New Town Community Centre who could use the courts.
