## October — Black History Season

We have been talking with the children about Black history Month and this year's theme: Proud To Be.

More details can be found here: <https://www.blackhistorymonth.org.uk/> Jahanara will have written to you to let you know the focus of the project that we would like each class to work on and there will be a sharing event in school after half term on Friday 5th November. We have also been taking a different approach this year (as suggested by Rachel – Ash class teacher) which has been to highlight an aspect of black history or culture each day. I have been reading children poetry by prominent black poets and authors each time we have an assembly.

## Friday 22nd October — Staff Training

There is no school tomorrow as we have an INSET day. An external trainer will be working with us on phonics and the links to early reading and writing. Teachers will also be working on the sequencing of the curriculum in our school, ensuring that it is planned clearly to maximise learning for our children.

## Visit from Muswell Hill Children's Bookshop

Sanchita from the Children's Bookshop came to school on Wednesday 20th October with a selection of books for our children to choose from. Thanks to the support of The Friends of Kentish Town (our Parent/Teacher Association) every child in our school was able to choose a book for their class book corner. Sanchita offered a wide selection of books, including titles with Black and Asian characters, reflecting the diversity in our community. Children reading (or being read to) is one of the most powerful ways for them to recover lost learning.


