

INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT

- 1 The name of the school is “Kentish Town Church of England Primary School”.
- 2 The school is a voluntary aided school.
- 3 The name of the governing body is “The governing board of Kentish Town Church of England Primary School”.
- 4 The governing body shall consist of:
 - a. 2 parent governors
 - b. 1 LA governor
 - c. 1 staff governor
 - d. 1 headteacher
 - e. 7 foundation governors
- 5 Total number of governors 12
- 6 The term of office of all governors is four years
- 7 Foundation governors shall be appointed by The London Diocesan Board for Schools
- 8
 - a. The holder of the following office shall be a foundation governor *ex-officio*: The incumbent of the Parish of Kentish Town
 - b. The Archdeacon of Hampstead shall be entitled to appoint a foundation governor to act in the place of the *ex-officio* governor whose governorship derives from the office named at 8a above, in the event that that *ex-officio* governor is unable or unwilling to act as a foundation governor, or has been removed from office under regulation 21(1) of the Regulations.
- 9 Not applicable
- 10 The Archdeacon of Hampstead shall be entitled to request the governing body to remove the *ex-officio* foundation governor referred to in 8a above and to appoint any substitute governor.
- 11 A trust exists.
- 12 *Ethos statement:*
