The Wolves in the Walls



Introducer 1: Welcome to the first Cedar Class assembly of the year.

Introducer 2: We are going to be sharing the story of The Wolves in the Walls with you today.

Introducer 3: So sit back, relax and enjoy!

Dance: Singing in the rain remix

(Wolves to mingle in audience then in position for dance. Lucy's family on stage joining in with dance. At end of song, wolves go behind wall.)

Lucy's family all on stage. Lucy's Mum sorting out jam. Others chilling.

Narrator 1: Inside the house, everything was quiet.

Narrator 2: Lucy's Mum was putting homemade jam into pots.

Narrator 3: Lucy's Dad was out at work.

Narrator 4: Lucy's brother was playing video games.

Narrator 5: And Lucy's grandparents were doing what old people do.

Lucy's Grandma: Hang on, what do old people do?

Lucy's Grandpa: I don't know, wear slippers and drink lots of tea?

Narrator 6: Everything was quiet, until Lucy began to hear some very strange noises...

Noise coming from inside walls.

Lucy (looking around, scared): What was that noise?

Lucy walks around stage, pressing her ear up against the wall and looking scared. Goes over to Mum.

Lucy: There are wolves in the wall!

Lucy's Mum: Wolves don't live in this part of the world! You must be hearing mice.

Lucy: Wolves!

Lucy's Mum: It can't be wolves, for you know what they say... if the wolves come out of the walls, it's all over!

Lucy: What's all over?

Lucy's Mum: It. Everyone knows that.

All family off stage. Lucy goes to bed. Lots of creepy noises. Some wolves peep around walls with fingers to lips.

Narrator 1: In the middle of the night, when everything was dark, Lucy heard the noises again.

Narrator 2: She could hear the wolves in the walls.

Narrator 3: Plotting their wolfish plots.

Narrator 4: Hatching their wolfish schemes.

Narrator 5: She heard them night after night.

Narrator 6: And day after day!

Daylight. Lucy's Dad playing his trumpet. Noises from walls.

Lucy: There are wolves in the walls!

Dad: I'm always leaving my favourite cheese everywhere, maybe it's rats?

Lucy: Wolves!

Dad: It can't be wolves, for you know what they say... if the wolves come out of the walls, it's all over! Now leave me alone, I need to practise my trumpet.

Dad exits stage to trumpet noises. Lucy wonders around looking sad. Her brother is playing video games. Noises from walls.

Lucy: There are wolves in the walls!

Lucy's brother: Bats!

Lucy: You think it's bats?

Lucy's brother: I think YOU are bats!

Narrator 1: Poor Lucy! No-one believes her!

Sign holder: Awwwwwwwwww

Song: Little talks.

Lucy goes back to sleep. Noises in wall become louder and louder. She looks terrified.

Narrator 2: But that night...

Everyone: THE WOLVES CAME OUT OF THE WALLS!

Song: It's a wolf.

(Begin slow motion then when song drops go into quick wolf dance.)

Family all running away. Wolves chase then proceed to chill in the family home.

Lucy's Mum: My children!

Lucy's Dad: My trumpet!

Lucy's brother: My videogames!

Lucy's Grandma: My slippers and tea!

Lucy's cat: Miaow!

Narrator 3: The family huddled at the bottom of the garden.

Narrator 4: They could see the wolves in their house.

Narrator 5: They watched for hours, not knowing what to do.

Narrator 6: Until finally, Lucy came up with a plan...

Lucy's Mum: We could move to Antarctica!

Lucy's Dad: We could live in a hot air balloon!

Lucy's brother: We could move to Outer Space!

Lucy: WE could live in the walls! The wolves aren't in them anymore and it's probably warmer than out here!

Family agree and sneak back towards the house. Latter part of <mark>It's a sin remix playing (0:26-0:44)</mark> and wolves partying so they don't notice family slipping into walls.

Narrator 1: Lucy and her family were appalled by what they saw!

Narrator 2: The wolves were eating Lucy's Mum's jam!

Narrator 3: And playing Lucy's Dad's trumpet!

Narrator 4: And beating Lucy's brother's high scores!

Lucy (peering around the wall): Right! That's it! Ready?

Narrator 5: And then, just like the wolves...

Everyone: THE PEOPLE CAME OUT OF THE WALLS!

Wolves run away off either side of the stage. <mark>O Fortuna plays (1:58-2:32)</mark> Battle scene in slow motion. Wolves finish off on ground waving white flags.

Wolf: It's all over!

Wolf: Run away!

Wolf: The people have come out of the walls!

Wolves run down the aisle.

Lucy's Dad: Well, I'm glad that's all over!

Lucy: Hang on! Can you hear that?

Elephant trumpeting.

<u>It's a Wolf</u>

When the wolves come out of walls We're going to eat a load of kids! We've always been the ones to blame...

No matter when or where or who We're going to gobble all of you! We've always been the ones to blame...
