Staffing

A big thank you in advance for your understanding and flexibility regarding staff changes. There are a number of staff who have been unwell recently and this means that we have to deploy other staff in order to keep our school open and running as normal. As you know, we only use supply teachers when we have no other option as we try to use staff who are known to our children. This may mean that on occasion your child's teacher or teaching assistant changes.

Willow Class
