## **School Uniform** From next week, we will be looking closely at school uniform. Please support us by ensuring your child/ren are in the correct school uniform. Our uniform is: Plain white Polo or T shirt (School logo recommended) Navy blue Polo or T shirt (School logo recommended) Navy blue tracksuit bottoms, skirt, trousers/leggings or shorts Navy blue pinafore/gingham dress/playsuit Navy blue fleece, cardigan, sweatshirt (School logo recommended) Navy blue or white socks. The school uniform is available to purchase from the school. PE Kit Navy blue shorts, jogging bottoms, white crew neck T-shirt and trainers or plimsoles. From Year 3 onwards children are expected to wear the PE kit in all PE lessons. The following items are **NOT** part of our uniform and should not be worn in school: Fashion logos of any sort Hooded fleeces/sweat shirts Denim items Trainers with lights or wheels High fashion or heeled shoes We have good quality second hand uniform available for free to parents and carers or you can purchase uniform via the school office or from our supplier here: Stitch Design Limited.
