Attendance.

Currently our school attendance is **well below** the national average (94.8%) at **92.9%** and is one of the lowest in Camden. This is due to large numbers of children having time off school due to illness and also families taking holidays during term time. We are hoping that all the winter illnesses have passed and we can get back to more regular attendance.

Last term, our Attendance Support Officer, Shuma Begum, met with families where there are issues relating to attendance in order to improve this. Poor school attendance can result in a penalty notice being issued by the local authority. Please help us by ensuring that your children are in school every day unless they are very unwell and on time in the mornings. Many thanks for your help with this.

NSPCC PANTS

This age appropriate scheme will be taught with the aim of helping our children to know that their body belongs to them, and they should tell someone they trust if anything makes them feel upset or worried.

It is advisable to do this bit by bit rather than trying to deal with it all in one go, weaving these chats into everyday discussions instead turning it into a big deal. Most importantly working together with parents and carers we will have the peace of mind that we are equipping the children with vital skills to help them keep safe now and in the future, both online and in the real world.

Friday 13th March


We are still looking for a longer term funder for this and hope to secure further funding soon.
