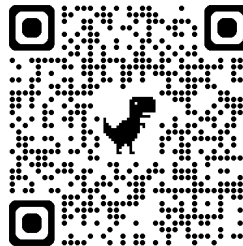


We also wanted to say a huge thank you to all the parents who are willing to undertake such physically grueling activities to raise funds for our children. Truly inspirational!

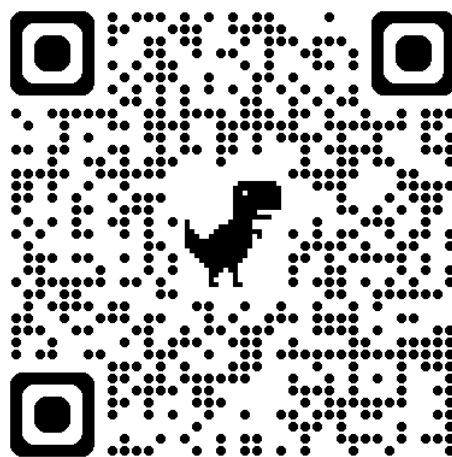

Fundraising Brief: Building a Greenhouse for Inclusive Learning at Kentish Town CE Primary School.
Project Title: Growing Together!

Overview

We are seeking support to build a fully accessible greenhouse within our primary school grounds—an inspiring, hands-on learning space that will benefit all pupils, including a significant number of children with Special Educational Needs (SEN), particularly Autism. This project is about far more than gardening; it is about creating a calm, engaging, and inclusive environment where every child can thrive.

Why a Greenhouse?

For many of our pupils, especially our Autistic community, traditional classroom settings can be overwhelming. A greenhouse offers a unique alternative—a structured yet flexible environment where learning becomes sensory, practical, and deeply meaningful. This space will allow children to:

- Experience hands-on learning through planting, growing, and nurturing living things
- Develop life skills such as responsibility, patience, and teamwork
- Engage with nature in a safe, predictable, and calming setting

Benefits for All Pupils

While the greenhouse is particularly impactful for children with SEN, it will enrich learning for every child in the school:

- Supports science, environmental education, and healthy living
- Encourages outdoor learning and physical activity
- Promotes teamwork, responsibility, and resilience
- Fosters a connection to sustainability and the natural world

What We Need

We are raising funds to cover:

- Construction of a durable, accessible greenhouse structure, including a solid base.
- Raised beds and adaptive gardening equipment
- Sensory-friendly design features (seating, shaded areas, clear pathways)
- Initial plants, seeds, and tools

We estimate the costs of the this to be around £25,000
